# Building Signage Rights (1): \$1,000,000 - SOLD

## Name the Main Floor (1): \$250,000

The space that welcomes everyone as they enter the Shelter and includes 14 Emergency Shelter bedrooms, main living area and kitchen.

## Wellness and Recreation Area/ Naming of lower floor (1): \$250,000

Larger, more planned space will allow programming to be delivered in a more comprehensive and planned way and additional programming can become reality. A space where youth can engage in yoga or other forms of exercise as well as an area with games and activities to pass the time in the evenings.

# Name the Transitional Housing Level (1): \$250,000

Transitional Housing will be housed on the top floor. This is a voluntary transition to an independent living program where youth and young adults learn responsibility and budgeting while paying minimal rent in a safe environment that prepares them for gain independence.

# Boardroom and Training area (1): \$125,000

This boardroom is not only where the SunriseHouse board meetings will be held but it is a room where youth and their families can develop more constructive and positive relationships through referral to mediation and other community services and where community agencies and associations can actively participate in efforts to improve the condition of families and youth. It also serves as a space for larger group programming such as Career and Employment assistance, Life skills development, and even providing Employment training like First Aid, the existing space is much too small.

## Kitchen and Dining Hall (1): \$150,000

This community kitchen for youth in the shelter will be a place where they can get enough food – and enough of the right kinds of food – to focus on things such as school, a job or counselling. Cooking classes and assisting in meal prep also prepare them for success outside of Sunrise House.

## Living Room/Common Area (1): \$125,000

A safe and comfortable space to watch TV, play games and sit in conversation with other shelter youth. Located on the main floor, it is sure to be a hub of activity.

## Shelter Bedrooms (14): \$50,000

You can give our youth a safe place to sleep, dream, and rebuild their lives. Sponsor a room and you'll ensure young people have access to critical supports during a most urgent time in their life.

## Intake Room (1): \$30,000

The safety & security of both the staff and the clients is essential. There is a great need for a secure intake room which allows the staff to asses a youth without giving them access to the entire building and putting themselves or other clients at risk.

## Transitional Housing Suites (10): \$30,000

This is a voluntary transition to an independent living program. This program prepares them for life and allows them to gain independence.

## Education and Life Skills Hub (1): \$50,000

A space with computers or tablets to work on life skills such as resume writing, school, online courses, research and more.

#### Family Support Office (1): \$25,000

A larger, more comfortable office for families and support staff to meet with the goal of decreasing the risk of youth homelessness by assisting the family in the building of healthy coping skills, positive communication, and resistance to crisis so that the youth can return safely home

#### Community Support Office (1): \$25,000

This larger office can be used by partners such as Alberta Health Services, Mental Health, RCMP and Health Professionals, etc. to meet with clients and to hold case conferences.

#### Deck and BBQ Area (1): \$25,000

An area where staff can BBQ and provide a healthy outdoor environment and an area where youth can sit in the sun and clear their minds.

#### Yard and Garden Area (1): \$25,000

It is important to create a safe space with limited visibility into the yard. We plan to accomplish that by creating a garden area, planting trees and fencing the space.

#### Basketball Area (1): \$25,000

What better way to clear your mind than to shoot some hoops and engage in some physical activity. Your sponsorship will provide a space where the youth can do just that.

#### Reading Area (1): 25,000

The shelter can be a busy place and providing a quieter corner for reading or journaling is essential to the well being of some youth.
